

Instructions for Filing a Will for Safekeeping:

- The Will must be sealed in a regular standard size envelope (4 1/8 inches by 9 1/2 inches)
- The front of the envelope must have the following:
 - Last Will and Testament of (Name of the Testator)
 - Date of Birth of Testator
 - Name of Executor (and successor(s), if any)
- The back of the envelope must have the signature of the Testator
- Will Filed for Safekeeping form must be completed
- Color copy of the Testator's current driver's license or state issued ID must be provided

- The filing fee is \$15.00. We accept money order or cashier's check. If you have an appointment for filing, Visa, MasterCard or Discover card payments can be accepted. Please note there will be a 5% service fee assessed to any debit/credit card transactions. Probate Court does not accept cash or personal checks.
