ADDENDUM NO. 1 TO RFP 21-0133-7

FOR: Annual Contract for Disaster Recovery Services (Debris Removal) for Chatham County Public Works

PLEASE SEE THE FOLLOWING ADDITIONS, CLARIFICATIONS AND/OR CHANGES:

1. **Question:** Does the County have a predesignated final disposal facility?
Response: No
2. **Question:** There is a significant cost difference between land based operations and land based operations. Can the County confirm that the line item for boat removal is intended for land based operations?
Response: The line item is for the collection of eligible vessels within the County land ROW.
3. **Question:** There is currently no line item for hauling construction and demolition debris to the debris management site, although there is a line item for reduction of C&D at the debris management site. Will the County consider adding a line item for hauling construction and demolition debris from the right of way to the debris management site?
Response: No, all eligible C&D debris will be transported to a County designated final disposal site.
4. **Question:** Ref. Page 7 of 58 – Paragraph 2.7: Does the County plan to make a single contract award or multiple awards?
Response: As stated in Section 5.1, last two sentences – The County’s intent is to award to a primary and a secondary contractor.
5. **Question:** Ref. Page 42 of 58 – Fee Schedule: The pricing schedule contains the following item descriptions for Task 4 “Eligible ROW C&D Debris Removal Work consists of the collection and transportation of Eligible C&D debris on the ROW to a County Designated Final Disposal Site.” Since there is a rate requested on Pg. 43 of 58, Fee Schedule, “DMS Management and Reduction of C&D Debris Through Grinding Work consists of management and operation of DMS locations for the reduction of Eligible disaster-related debris through grinding.” can the County please confirm if the Item description for ROW C&D Debris removal should read “Eligible ROW C&D Debris Removal Work consists of the collection and transportation of Eligible C&D debris on the ROW to a County approved DMS location or County Designated Final Disposal Site.”?
Response: See response to Question 3.
6. **Question:** Ref. Page 43 of 58 – Fee Schedule: With respect to the pricing schedule item “DMS Management and Reduction of C&D Debris Through Grinding Work consists of management and operation of DMS locations for the reduction of Eligible disaster-related debris through grinding.” and Pg 32 of 58, Section 5. 7 .3, would the County also permit reduction of C&D by compaction as an acceptable method of reduction?
Response: No
7. **Question:** Ref. Page 45 of 58 – Fee Schedule: For Task 1, please clarify how the County wants proposers to calculate the amount to put into the “TOTALS” column as there are no

estimated quantities like the other tasks.

Response: The Revised Fee Schedule has been adjusted to reflect unit prices only for Task 1.

8. **Question:** Ref. Page 19 of 58 – Paragraph 4.5.6: Regarding the evaluation of the hourly pricing, how does the County intend on weighing the hourly items for the Fee Schedule evaluation points?

Response: The “Initial Push” consists of hourly pricing. The “Initial Push” is a very small percentage of the overall work that would be performed during an event. The weight of points for the fees is focused on the Total for Tasks 2-12.

9. **Question:** Ref. Page 16 of 58 – Paragraph 3.15.B: It appears from this paragraph that you are asking for two payment and performance bonds; one if awarded and another within seven days after an event notice to proceed. Is this correct?

Response: No, bonds will be required within seven days after an Event Notice to Proceed as stated in Section 3.15, 5.5.2 and legal advertisement.

10. **Question:** Ref. Page 35 of 58 – Paragraph 5.7.1: Does the County currently have any permitted DMS locations outside of those named in the Chatham County Debris Management Overall Coordination and Strategy Plan and if so, could you share those locations?

Response: The County does not have any other permitted DMS locations outside of those named in the Chatham County Debris Management Overall Coordination and Strategy Plan at this time.

11. **Question:** Ref. Page 28 of 58 – Paragraph 5.5.4: Does the County currently have a Debris Monitoring Firm under contract, and if so, could you please provide the name of the firm(s)?

Response: Yes, Thompson Consulting is the firm that currently provides debris monitoring services under contract.

12. **Question:** Are you able to provide the names and titles of evaluation committee members?

Response: The County does not provide the names and titles of the evaluation committee members. However, representatives from CEMA, Public Works, Purchasing and the WMBE Coordinator will be part of the committee.

13. **Question:** Are you able to provide the date the intent to award will be made available, and how will it be communicated to the proposers?

Response: No, not at this time. Proposers will be notified if they have been chosen for an interview after proposals have been evaluated.

14. **Question:** Will this contract be used to perform services on any state-maintained roads within the County, and if the answer is yes, does the County have MOUs in place with the Georgia Department of Transportation?

Response: GDOT has the responsibility to ensure debris management activities occur on state-maintained roads. We are aware that the County can assist GDOT with debris management activities on these roads through a mutual aid agreement. Presently, however, Chatham County does not have a mutual aid agreement with GDOT for debris management activities. In the future, if this contract is used to assist GDOT, the scope of the mutual aid support will be coordinated and defined in a MOU.

15. **Question:** I would like to confirm that a bid bond is not required per Attachment I-1.

Response: A Bid Bond is not required to be submitted. Please see response to Question 9 for Payment and Performance Bond requirements.

16. **Question:** Can you please provide the bid tabulations from the previous bidding cycle?

Response: The current contract was a result of a Request for Proposal process so there is not a bid tabulation. The list of proposers for that solicitation is as follows: CrowderGulf, Ashbritt Inc., J.B. Coxwell Contracting, Inc., Custom Tree Care, Inc., Tag Gridning Services, Inc., Ceres Environmental Services, Inc., TFR, Enterprises, Inc. DRC Emergency Services.

17. **Question:** Can DBE businesses be listed on Attachment F (M/WBE Participation Form)?

Response: No, the M/WBE Participation form is to be used to note those two distinctions.

18. **Question:** Is a bid bond required for this project?

Response: See response to Question 15.

19. **Question:** Is there a goal for minority participation?

Response: The Request for Proposal document addresses MWBE Participation and the total possible points in Section 4.5.4. Additional resources for this Section are in Section 2.18.

20. **Question:** Will the bid date remain December 16th?

Response: Proposal due date remains December 16th.


21. **CHANGE:** Fee schedule (attached) has been revised. Proposers must use the Revised Fee Schedule.
